

## SAMPLES OF BIBLIOGRAPHIC CITATIONS FOR ELECTRONIC PUBLICATIONS

Kate L. Turabian's *Manual for Writers of Term papers, Theses, and Dissertations*, Sixth ed. Section 8.141 states: "Citations of electronic documents can follow the same general form as citations of printed materials." At the end of the citation, add a note indicating Internet source, URL, and access date. Use the sample citations below, taken from:

University of Southern Mississippi. "Turabian Style Guide." 8 February 2001. Internet on-line. <<http://www.lib.usm.edu/~instruct/guides/turabian.html>>. [5 December 2000].

" Author. "Title of Work." In *Title of Complete Work* or *title of list/site*. Place: Publisher, Date of creation. Internet on-line. Available from Name of Organization <Internet address>. [Date of access].

### Web item: entire work

### Part of a work

## **BIBLIOGRAPHIC CITATIONS: TURABIAN TRADITIONAL STYLE**

"

Two forms of citation are permitted by Turabian—the traditional method, detailed here, and the scientific, or parenthetical reference method detailed in its own pathfinder. Samples are taken from Turabian, Kate L. *A Manual for Writers of Term Papers, Theses, and Dissertations*. 6<sup>th</sup> ed. Revised by John Grossman and Alice Bennett. Chicago: The University of Chicago Press, 1996.

- All references should be single-spaced with one blank line between entries.
- The first line of each entry is flush left, and any runover lines are indented five spaces.
- Underline if *italics* is not available. Do not use both *italics* and underlining.
- Each sample citation is preceded by the Turabian reference number.

### **11.3 Book, One Author**

" Author. *Book Title*. Place: Publisher, date.

" Jones, Barry. *Technology and the Future of Work*. New York: Oxford University Press, 1995.

### **9.27 Two or More Books by the Same Author**

To cite two or more books by the same author, give the name in the first entry only. Thereafter, in place of the name, type an eight-space line, followed by a period and the title.

" Walters, Glenn D. *The Criminal Lifestyle*. Newberry Park, CA: Sage Publications, 1990.

\_\_\_\_\_. *Drugs and Crime in Lifestyle Perspective*. Thousand Oaks, CA: Sage Publications, 1994.

### **11.4-11.6 Book, Two or More Authors**

If there are more than three authors, name only the first and add *et al.*, or you may give all names in full in the order of their appearance on the title page.

" Cole, Ted, and Christopher E. Smith. *Criminal Justice*. Belmont, CA: Wadsworth Pub. Co., 1996.

### **11.7 Book, No Author Given**

*Title*. Place: Publisher, date.

" *New Life Options: The Working Women's Resource Book*. New York: McGraw-Hill, 1976.

**11.42 Encyclopedia Articles**

Well known reference books are generally not listed in bibliographies

**11.26 Component Part by One Author in a Work by Another**

Beech, Mary. "The Domestic Realm in the Lives of Hindu Women." In *Separate Worlds: Studies of purdah in South Asia*. 110-38. Delhi: Chanakya, 1982

**11.28 Complete Work within a Work by One Author**

Titles of short poems and short stories should be put in double quotation marks, but italicize or underline the titles of longer works.

Milton, John. *Paradise Lost*. In *The Complete Poetical Works of John Milton*, ed. William Vaughn Moody. Student's Cambridge Edition. Boston: Houghton Mifflin, 1899.

**11.39-11.40 Articles in a Journal**

Include issue number when each issue is paged separately.

Author. "Article Title." *Journal Title* volume number, issue number (date): page numbers.

Jackson, Richard. "Regional Inequality in Papua New Guinea." *Australian Geographer* 14 (May 1979): 175-84.

Smith, Lawrence P. "Sailing Close to the Wind." *Politics in Action* 10, no. 4: 80-102.

**11.41 Article in a Magazine**

Author. "Article Title." *Magazine Title* Day Month Year, pages.

Knight, Robin. "Poland's Feud in the Family." *U.S. News and World Report*, 10 September 1990, 52-53, 56.

**11.50 Unpublished Interview by Writer of Paper**

Greco, Joe, mayor of Tampa, Interview by author, 23 September 1999, Tampa. Tape recording.
